Q: Do we use gluten-free hosts?

No, we use low-gluten hosts, not gluten-free ones, as the Eucharist must be made from wheat bread. Our hosts are approved by the USCCB and contain such a low amount of gluten that someone with Celiac Sprue Disease would need to consume 270 wafers at once to trigger a reaction! If you need a low-gluten host, ask a sacristan before Mass.

The Noise of the Day

"Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

Stop judging and you will not be judged.

Stop condemning and you will not be condemned.

Forgive and you will be forgiven."

Luke 6:36-38

How appropriate is our Gospel Reading at this time in history! Each day we are inundated with political news, one side judgmentally condemning the other. Regardless of the media that we listen to or read regularly, we are typically hearing only one often-biased and speculative report of unfolding events. Oftentimes, unnecessarily striking fear and trepidation in hearts and minds, affecting our attitudes, our peacefulness, our hope, our loving relationships with one another and our overall spirituality.

But the Gospel gives us clear direction to lead us out of the noise surrounding us. It lets us know that despite the challenges of our times, we need to keep God's mercy commanding both our actions and reactions. It always comes down to the Golden Rule, a short and profound truth: "Do to others as you would have them do to you."

Accepting that our views are just that our views and not the views of others, can be difficult and humbling. We often think that our life-wisdom, experiences and reasoning are somehow more informed or enlightened than the statements espoused by others. I can recall several times in conversations with family, friends or colleagues when I felt compelled to give an opposing opinion or viewpoint on an issue—trying to defend or convince others that my position was the *correct* way of thinking. But isn't that the crux of what we are being told through the Gospel today? Jesus tells us to stop judging, stop condemning, do good, and love. When we make judgments about the beliefs or statements of others, hear or say aggressive words, we are told to open ourselves to forgive and we will be forgiven. As a sinner, each day and each week I continue to strive to live those words. Many times I have fallen short. But I continue to seek and pray for a more loving and genuine transformation through the Eucharist, praying to become more like the person that Jesus wants me to be. For we are all called to become what we receive in His love, forgiveness and mercy.

February 24 marks three years since the start of the war in Ukraine, which has forced nearly seven million Ukrainians to seek refuge in foreign lands.
