The Apostles' Creed says Jesus descended into Hell...What's that all about?

A: The Apostles' Creed is a later Latin adaptation of the Nicene Creed. The phrase "descended into hell" comes from a Latin word for the underworld, not the fiery Hell of damnation. It means Jesus went to the realm of the dead, where souls awaited His victory on the Cross.

The Enemy of Our Human Nature

In the *Spiritual Exercises* St. Ignatius of Loyola refers to Satan as "the Enemy of our human nature," and there is a portion where he fleshes out three main ways this Enemy tends to attack us. Today's Gospel displays the third way, where the Enemy acts like a general in a battle; St. Ignatius writes:

"...the enemy acts like a military commander who is attempting to conquer and plunder his objective. The captain and leader of an army on campaign sets up his camp, studies the strength and structure of a fortress, and then attacks at its weakest point. In the same way, the enemy of human nature prowls around and from every side probes all our theological, cardinal, and moral virtues. Then at the point where he finds us weakest and most in need in regard to our eternal salvation, there he attacks and tries to take us."

When we look at the Gospel of Jesus being tempted in the desert, we notice the Enemy's tactics; he saw that Jesus was very hungry, and so he suggests that Jesus put aside His humanity for a second and use His Divine Power to change stones into bread. But Jesus quotes Scripture, testifying to His trust in His Father's providence and His faithfulness to His Word. This reveals something to us about Jesus: His will, not His appetites, ruled Him.

Then the Enemy starts using God's Word as his weapon, striking at other strong desires in Jesus' heart: to be the King of our world, and for all to know that He is the Son of God. Yet again Jesus resists the temptation to take the fast and easy route, choosing instead to follow the path of His Father's will, which not only leads to oases of peace in the desert, but leads us out of the desert, out of the wilderness, and beyond the Enemy's reach in our Father's House. As we consider this Gospel and our own lives, we might reflect on how the Enemy attacks our weaknesses and vulnerabilities, and what we can do, with Jesus' help, to shore up our defenses, to conquer our appetites, and to do our Father's will in all things, even if it is the longer, more difficult but ultimately fulfilling road.
