

# What is a holy day of obligation and why are they important?

A: A Holy Day of Obligation is a feast day when Catholics are required to attend Mass, just like on Sundays. In the Ten Commandments, God calls us to set aside time for worship, and the Church designates these days to honor key moments in salvation history. They remind us to make God the center of our lives and give thanks for His saving work.

# **Turn Our Hearts to God**

Lent is a time to reflect on what keeps us from God and from lives of holiness and to make a conscious choice to turn again toward the light. Metanoia. As our Parish Vision Statement professes, we are called to bear hope and healing, engaging our whole selves to shine God's light into the world.

This Lent, I've been praying through theologian Louis Savary's *The New Spiritual Exercises: In the Spirit of Pierre Teilhard de Chardin.* In Week 1, he invites us to reflect on the relationship between our personal sin and social sin, which "is systemic, that is, it is manifested and 'lives' in the social structures functioning in the larger society." Savary points out how Jesus' public ministry constantly challenged social sin, from his critique of the Pharisees' religious hypocrisy to his upending of social ostracism for the ritually impure, tax collectors, etc.

This week, if you're at one of the Scrutiny masses (the Scrutinies are special rites for those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil), you will hear the story of the woman at the well. With this woman, Jesus upends societal norms around gender and ethnicity, welcoming the outcast into the kingdom of God where social sin yields to the beloved community.

If you're not attending one of the Scrutiny masses, you'll hear Luke's Gospel featuring a fig tree, and the call to bear good fruit. As in the parable of the talents, Jesus is guiding us to turn our gifts toward building God's kingdom.

We're trying to do this kingdom-building work in our family by participating in the CRS Rice Bowl, a daily Lenten program that helps families explore the root causes of one social sin, global hunger while participating in prayer, almsgiving, and fasting. My kids, ages 7 and 10, love this program, taking turns reading the prayers, answering the questions, giving alms in response, and even cooking the meatless recipes on Fridays. We watch the videos together, the most recent on a family struggling in Nigeria, and then talk about what we've learned. My daughter asks, "What else can we do to help them?"

This week, let us turn our hearts to God. In the face of social sin, how can we use our gifts to be a light of hope in the world? Where can we bear *hope and healing?*

## Catholic Social Teaching #5: Solidarity

As a member of the Rotary Club of Cincinnati, I have had the opportunity to participate in many service projects over the years. In the fall of 2014, I participated in a Rotary project at Camp Allyn in Batavia, Ohio.

Camp Allyn is nestled among 46 acres of trees, nature trails and small ponds and provides a supportive and inclusive environment for individuals with disabilities. Rotary works with Stepping Stones, a disability services and support organization, to provide services at the camp. Programs support children, teens and adults with various disabilities on the pathway to more independence to help them reach their full potential. Our project was to create an extended nature viewing area that was wheelchair accessible. Every year, Rotary provides funding to Camp Allyn and members participate in various projects to support the camp. Each summer, members of the Rotary Club offer tethered hot air balloon rides to campers.

In Catholic Social Teaching, solidarity means recognizing our shared responsibility to one another, which applies to caring for the handicapped and disabled by actively working to ensure they have equal access to opportunities, are treated with dignity, and are fully integrated into society. I have been fortunate to see that in action at Camp Allyn.
