

A: We fast for at least one hour before Communion to prepare spiritually and physically. Water is allowed because it's a basic necessity. Medicine and anything needed to take it are also permitted, as those with medical needs are exempt from fasting.

A Call to Walk with Jesus

Today, we begin our journey to the Easter Triduum by recalling and celebrating the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, where the joyous crowds of people received and hailed Him, proclaiming, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" Jesus's entry on a donkey—not by another way—showed His humility and that He came in peace.

The crowds of people laid down their cloaks and branches so that His kingly path was fully covered, preventing both He and His donkey from touching the dirt. This image invites us to ask ourselves what we are laying down to receive Jesus each day in our hearts and minds. Are we joyfully offering our gifts and sacrifices to exalt and glorify Him and His teachings? Are we mindfully laying down our gratitude and prayers at Mass as He approaches us through the Eucharist?

The readings today are also a poignant reminder that the crowd that celebrated Jesus' arrival as King soon called for His brutal crucifixion. The stark contrast between the shouts of ultimate praise, later followed by insults, betrayals, and cries for His death, exemplifies the vast moral complexity of humans and the destructive power of mob mentality. It gives us a glimpse of what Jesus must have experienced through His journey along the way of the Cross. Each Palm Sunday, this contrast calls us to examine our own faith and remind ourselves to stay internally peaceful, hopeful, and steadfast through the teachings of Jesus, despite sometimes loud and condemning cries and negative influences in our own world.

Palm Sunday can be a catalyst for us to rededicate ourselves to the commitment to walk with Jesus through His Passion and ultimately to the Resurrection. We can prepare ourselves to walk with Jesus on the journey of Holy Week by faithfully embracing both His triumph and His suffering, becoming more obedient to God's will through Jesus's examples of humility, peace, mercy, love, and forgiveness—regardless of the challenges, betrayals, or life circumstances we face.

As we begin Holy Week with reverence, we reflect on Christ's entire journey and prepare our hearts and minds for the overwhelming gratitude that we will experience on Good Friday when we recount His suffering and ultimate submission to God's plan for our eternal salvation. May the palms we hold symbolize the joy of Jesus's life, His ministry of peace, and ultimately His suffering and sacrifice for us. Let today be our call to walk with Jesus in both triumph and suffering, with hearts open to the transformative power of His love.
