Retreat for Adult Children of Divorce or Separation

The Life-Giving Wounds Retreat is a Wounds powerful opportunity for healing for adults with divorced or separated parents. Held

November 15-16 at the Jesuit Spiritual Center in Milford, this weekend retreat offers insight, spiritual guidance, and community for those seeking to better understand and heal from the wounds of their parents' separation. Rooted in Catholic teaching and led by licensed mental health professionals, the retreat includes lodging, meals, and all materials for \$250 per person, with limited scholarships available. Participants must be 18 or older. Space is limited, and a \$50 deposit is required to reserve a spot. A waitlist will be available once the retreat fills. Catechetical



Q: What is meant by the phrase 'I believe in the communion of saints'?

A: It means we believe we are baptized into more than a faith tradition—we're baptized into a family. God is our Father, Jesus our Savior and Brother, Mary our Mother, and the saints are our spiritual siblings. This communion isn't broken by death: the saints in Heaven remain united with us on Earth in the one Body of Christ. When we say "communion of saints," we affirm that we're never alone—we belong to a vast, holy family that spans Earth and Heaven, always interceding, encouraging, accompanying one another.

the tremendous gift we have received in the Eucharist. Vatican II teaches us that, "Taking part in the Eucharistic sacrifice, which is the fount and apex of the whole Christian life, they offer the Divine Victim to God, and offer themselves along with It" (Lumen Gentium #11). Here at the altar, at every Mass, by the Holy Spirit and through the authority given to the priest at his ordination, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Being baptized into His Body, the Church, it makes absolute sense that we would be nourished by the Same, just as our bodies nourish their own members.

Why a priesthood through which this gift is ministered? To remind us not only of the truth that this gift was given its power through a sacrifice made for all our sins-Jesus the Lamb of God offering Himself as Jesus our High Priestbut also that the priesthood of the baptized might have, in the ordained clergy, an example of faith, of how to love and serve one another in the pattern established by Jesus. In other words, when a priest repeats those words of Jesus over the bread and wine, he is as much "doing this in memory of" Jesus but also declaring to the people present, "This is my body...this is my blood," that by the power of this gift he, as a priest, may feed and tend the sheep of Christ's flock with his whole self, just as Jesus did. A priest hopes to lay down his own life for those he serves, in imitation of Jesus, Who through His priests and their ministry "...unceasingly builds up and leads His Church" (Catechism #1547).

So it is that I thank God, and all of the people of this parish, who have blessed me with four years of being able to serve you in this way. In early August I will depart Cincinnati for a few weeks to visit family and friends before I begin my tertianship in Sri Lanka. During that time I will be praying, reflecting upon my life as a Jesuit, revisiting the founding documents of our Order, undergoing the Spiritual Exercises, serving and ministering among the poor, among other experiences and such by which I will reflect on my vocation and prepare for Final Vows. After this I will receive a new assignment, though I do not know where that will be at this time.

Thank you all for welcoming me into this community, for your prayers and support! You will always be in my prayers, as I hope I will remain in yours.
