Catechetical



Why does the priest say "The mystery of faith," and why not at a different point in the Mass?

A: The priest says this right after Jesus' words, "Do this in memory of me," marking the moment the Eucharist becomes His Body and Blood. It invites us to respond in faith to the mystery we've just witnessed: Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection made present. This moment is intentional—meant to affirm our belief in what the Eucharist truly is, not just a symbol. It's not meant to be said elsewhere in the Mass, because it belongs exactly at this powerful turning point.

Our Father

At the Savior's command, we hear at every Mass, and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say. In all likelihood the Lord's Prayer is the first prayer we learned as children, and our "go to" prayer when we pray. But we must remember by teaching us this prayer—though Luke's version is different from Matthew's, which is the one we pray—that He has not only taught us a prayer to pray, but also a model of prayer. In other words, He is teaching us how to pray, and the most important thing about prayer that He teaches and empowers us to speak with God, to pray, to call upon God in the same way HE does: Father.

In ancient days God revealed His Name to Moses so that the people not only knew what God had sent him, but also so that they could call upon Him and know that He would hear them, for to know the true name of any god was to have power over it. Thus the gods of Greece, Rome, Egypt and elsewhere never revealed their names, leaving their devotees to either come up with their own names and titles for the gods, hoping their guesses are close or at least flattering, or the gods would reveal a name or title that they personally enjoyed. The God of Israel, however, desired to be on a first-name basis with them. How blessed are we, then, that through our baptism we sinners, daringly, address God not by name as if we are mere friends or colleagues, but we call upon Him as Father because we are His children, and He attends to our prayers and needs as does a good father!

Today marks my final Sunday presiding at Mass here at St. Xavier Church. It has been a privilege to be a spiritual father to the people of God here and throughout the Cincinnati area. I hope that I have, by the grace of God, lived up to the name of "Father" and have, in one way or another, helped each of you grow closer to Him, through His Son. Do pray for me as I take the next step in my own journey in His will, and know of my prayers for you as well.


